You will study four mandatory units:

- Principles of Health and Social Care
- Anatomy and Physiology for Health and Social Care
- Person-Centred Approach to Care
- Supporting People with Mental Health Conditions

You will also study two optional units from the following:

- Investigating Public Health
- Supporting People in Relation to Sexual Health, Pregnancy and Postnatal Health
- Supporting Health Nutrition and Lifestyles

Specific Entry Requirements

Average GCSE point score of 5 or above including GCSE Grade 5 in English Language.

You will need access to a computer to complete work outside of lessons.

Learning Methods

You will learn through a variety of methods including lectures, group activities, independent research and discussion.

Assessment

A combination of two externally assessed exam units and four internally assessed coursework assignments.
